

Steve Wermiel is a professor of practice at American University Washington College of Law where he teaches constitutional law, First Amendment and a seminar on the Supreme Court. Before becoming a professor, he was a newspaper reporter for 20 years, including 12 years as Supreme Court correspondent for the Wall Street Journal. He also worked for the Boston Globe for 8 years. He graduated from Tufts in 1972 with a BA in political science and Washington College of Law in 1982 with a JD.

He is the co-author of two books, *Justice Brennan: Liberal Champion*, published in 2010, and *The Progeny: Justice William J. Brennan's Fight to Preserve the Legacy of New York Times v. Sullivan*, published in 2014. He has authored many law review articles and writes a regular online column for SCOTUSblog explaining the Supreme Court for law students. He is an active member of the American Bar Association where he has worked for sixteen years in the Section of Civil Rights and Social Justice, of which he is a past chair. He is president-elect of the Tufts University Alumni Association.
