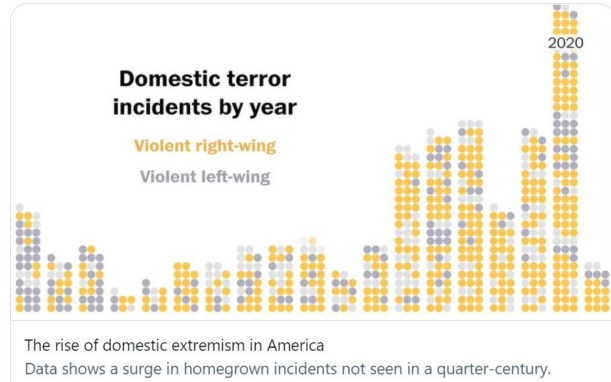

Domestic terror incidents have hit new highs, led by white supremacists, anti-government groups and others on far right, data shows

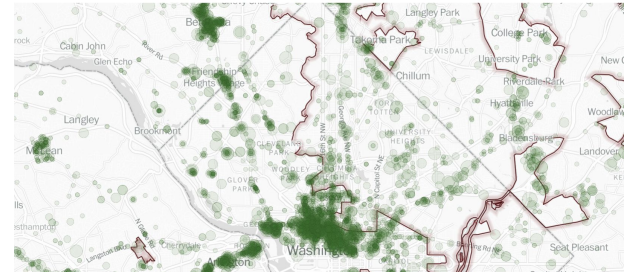

There was nothing fancy about our spreadsheet. It had maybe a thousand or so rows. Both before and after that story, I did data work that was much more complicated and interesting from a professional point of view.

Yet nothing else I’ve done came close to having the impact of that simple spreadsheet. Just because the data is simple doesn’t mean it can’t have major implications. It’s a lesson I’ll never forget.

12. If you extensively used computer-assisted reporting skills, please answer the following:

a) We built a database of all priests of the Boston archdiocese who had been on any type of leave between 1983 and 2001. The archdiocese's annual directories, which include the assignments of all priests, were the primary source for this database. Building the database involved several weeks of work by four reporters. It showed that the number of priests on different types of leave mushroomed between the mid-1980s and the mid-1990s, as more and more victims came forward with allegations, and the Church secretly placed scores of priests on various types of administrative leave. The database was a major indicator of the extent of the problem.

b) We used the state trial court database to search for civil lawsuits that involved priests and the archdiocese of Boston. To facilitate that search, we obtained from the trial court administrator the docket numbers of all civil cases involving about 15 lawyers who were believed to have been involved in sexual abuse cases. We checked every one of those cases, about 1,500 in all, and found some lawsuits involving priests. We have also made extensive use of on-line databases to locate both priests and victims and others with knowledge of the abuse. These include a state database of driver's licenses, and subscription services such as Nexis.com, Choicepoint and Accurint.

c) We used Excel Spreadsheet to prepare the database of priests who had been placed on leave.

d) As noted above, we obtained docket numbers of lawyers from the state to facilitate our search for lawsuits involving the Church.

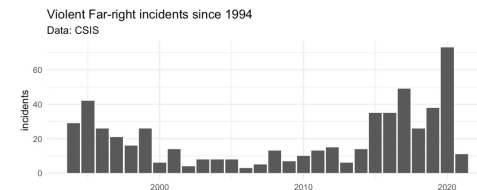

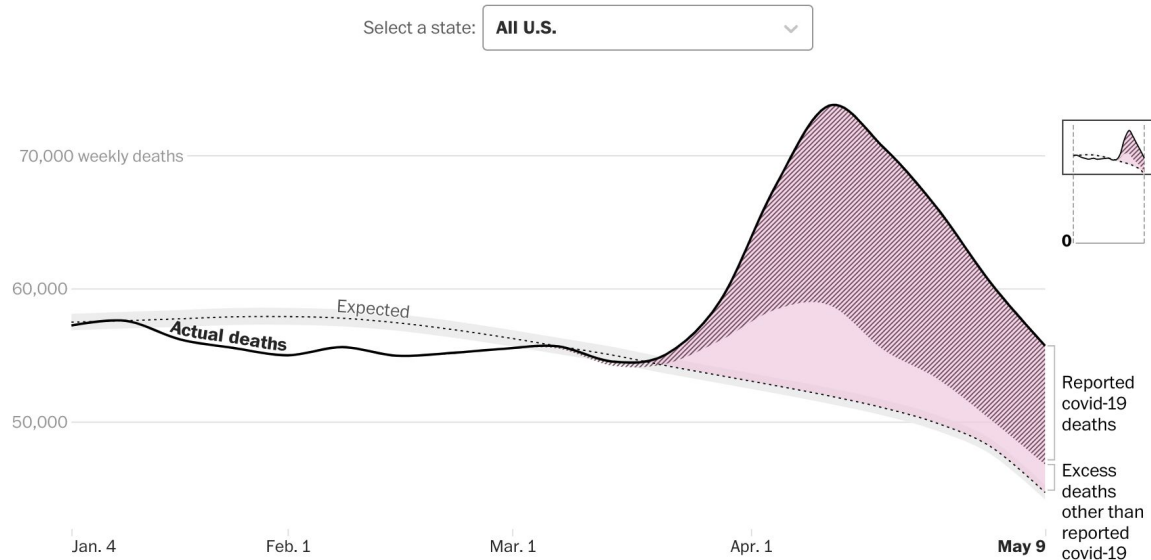

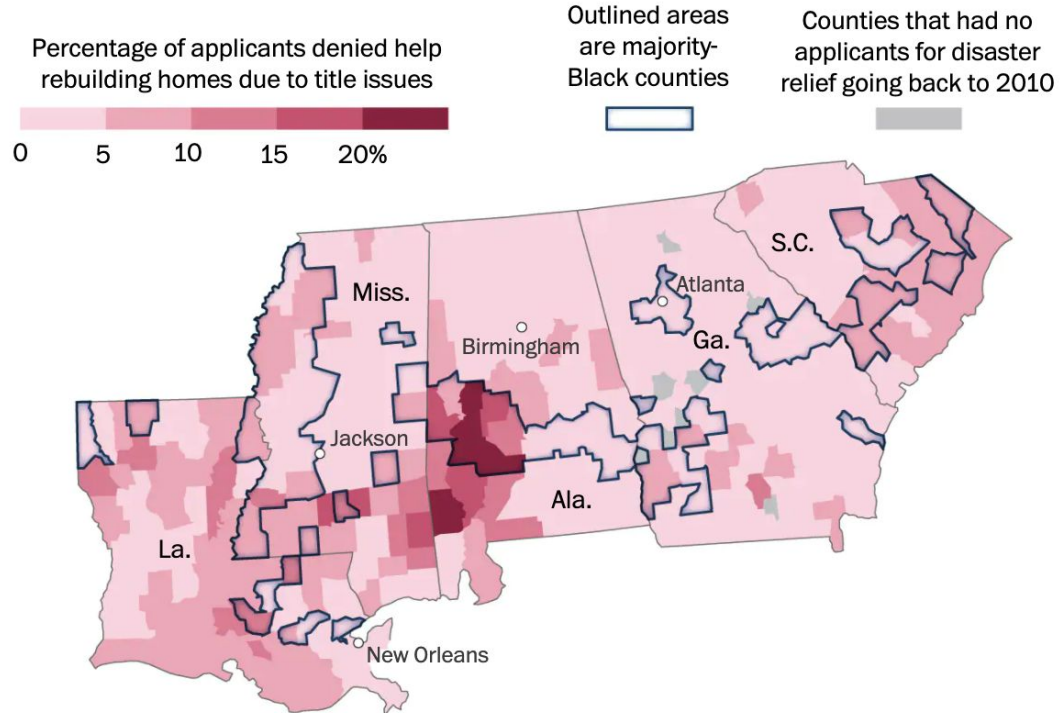

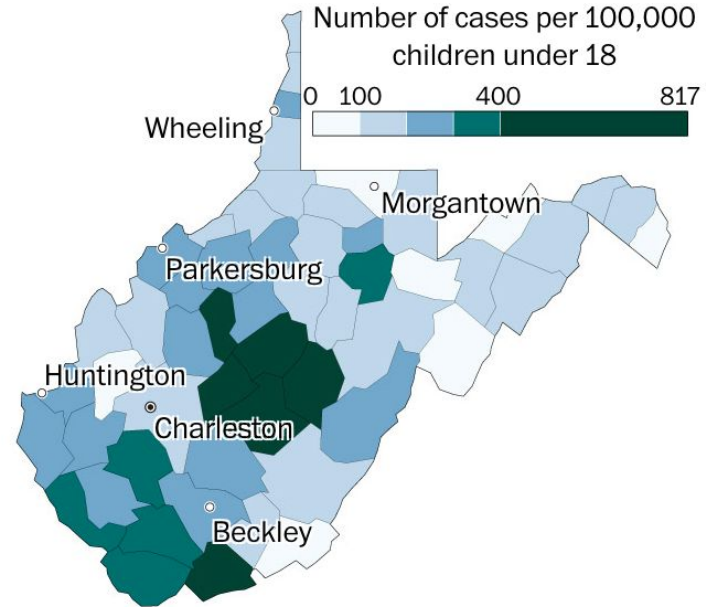

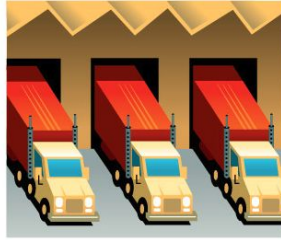

Manufacturers

The oxycodone pills' journey begins at Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals. The tablets are created and packaged in a facility in Hobart, N.Y.



Distributors

Mallinckrodt sends the pills to a network of distributors like Sunrise Wholesale and KeySource Medical. The distributors then supply the drugs to retailers.



Retailers

Retailers such as pharmacies and hospitals dispense drugs that doctors prescribe to patients. Some retailers have been accused of illegally diverting oxycodone.



Patient

When patients pay in cash or receive an unusually high volume of oxycodone, that can be an indication of abuse or diversion of the pills to the black market.

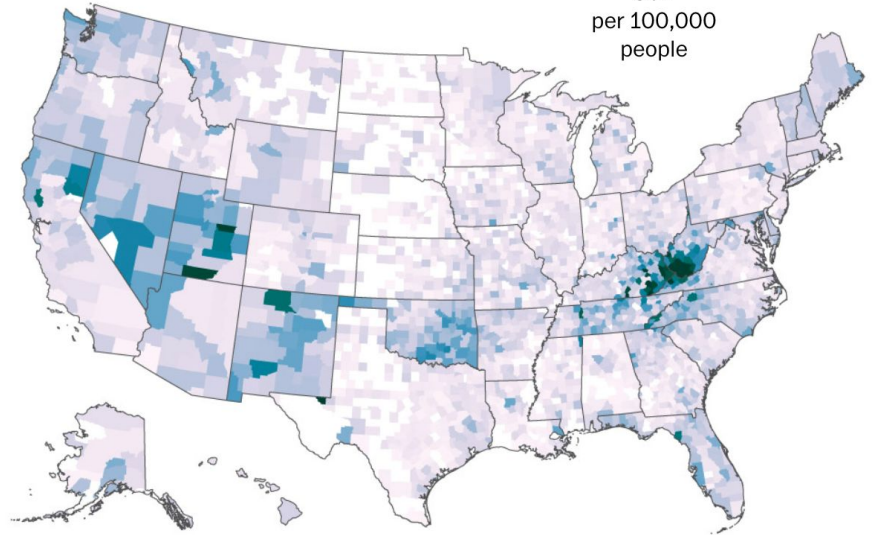

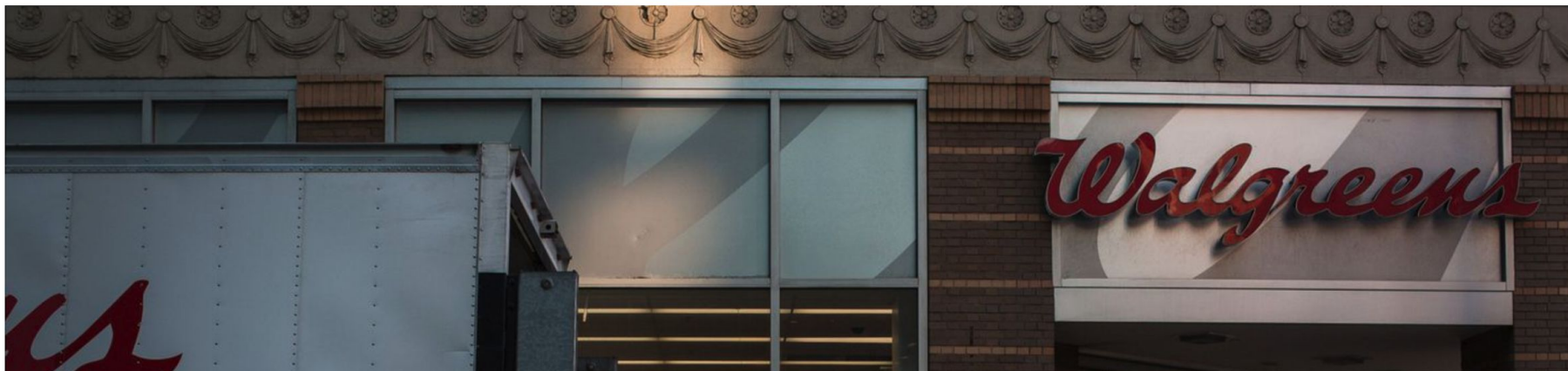

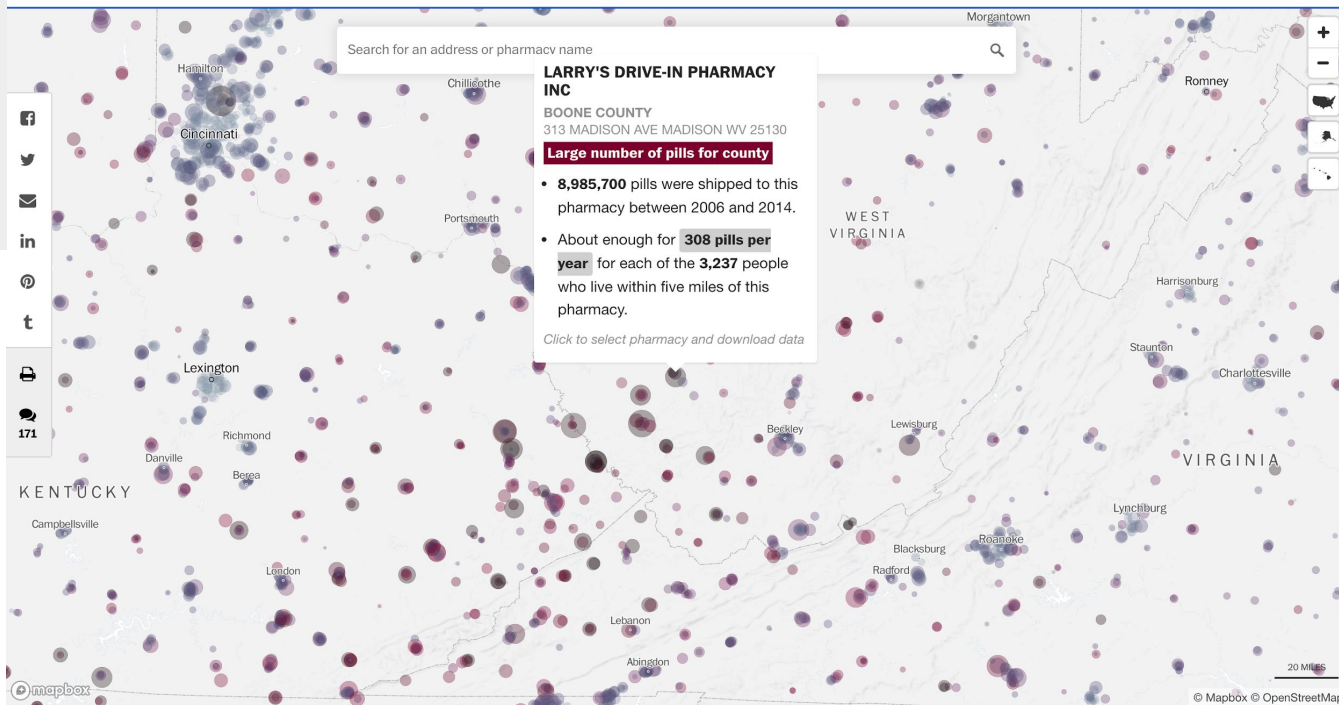

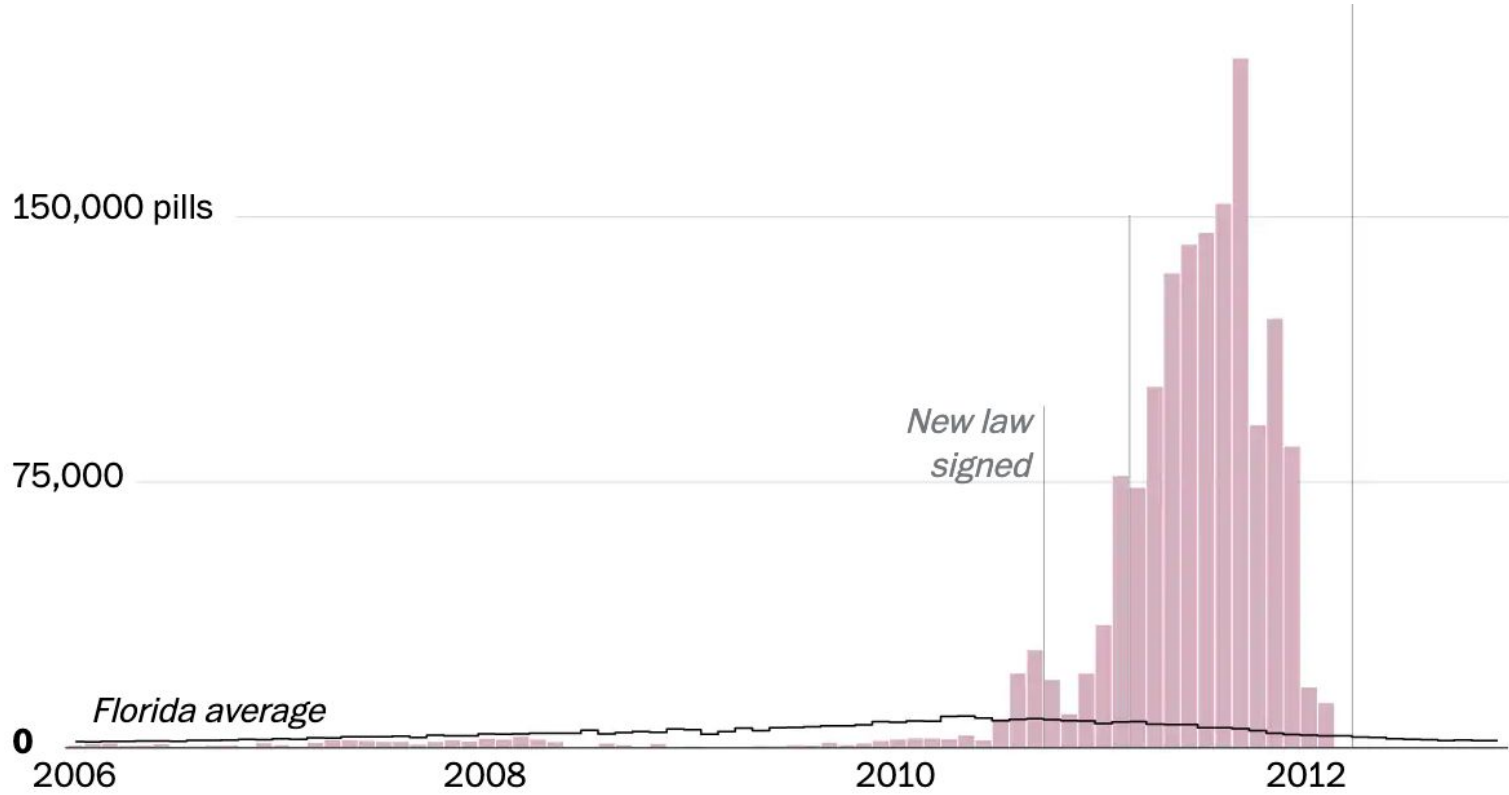

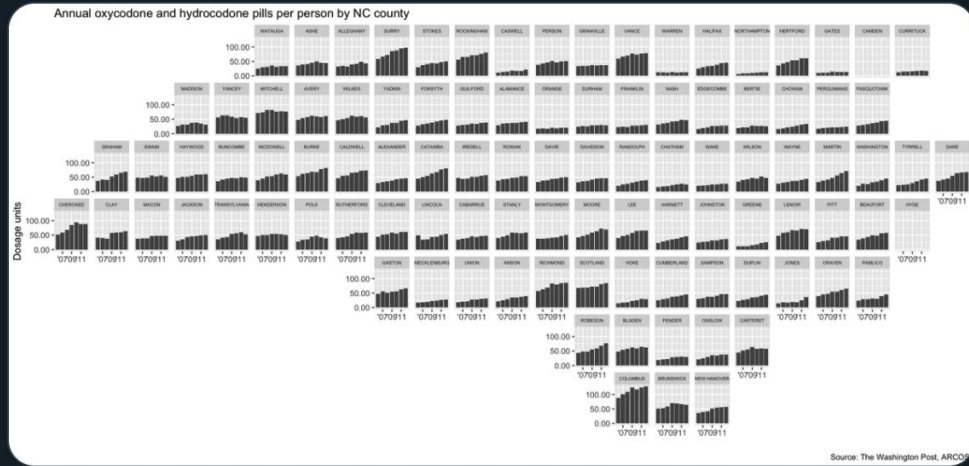

Two Louisiana pharmacies owned by Republican Rep. **Ralph Abraham**, Clinic Pharmacy of Mangham and Adams Clinic Pharmacy of Winnsboro, sit just 12.5 miles apart and serve a combined community of approximately 6,000 people. Yet despite serving relatively sparse populations, the two pharmacies reportedly prescribed a total of 1,478,236 doses of opioid painkillers from 2006 to 2012, more than 35 doses per person, according to a report from the [Bayou Brief](#).

State Senator Shane Reeves of Murfreesboro says he wasn't surprised to see his pharmacy as the top recipient of opioids in Tennessee — more than double the next highest pharmacy in the state according to a [Washington Post database](#).

Over a six year period, more than 45 million pain pills passed through what is now named Twelve Stone Health Partners. But Reeves also rejects that his

business contributed to the opioid epidemic.

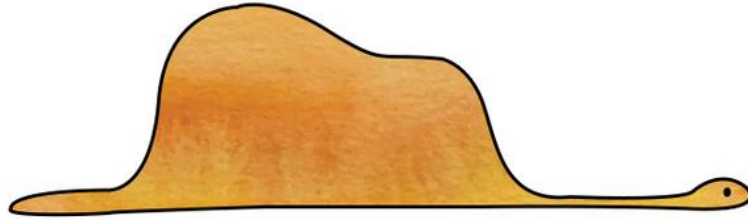

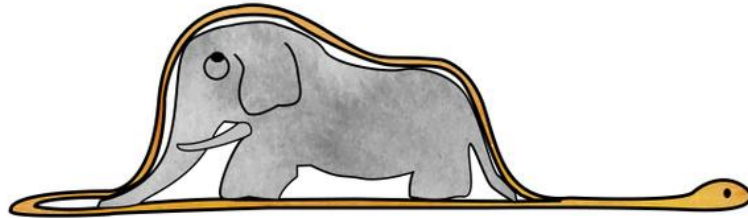
