
# The State of State Election Law: Where We Are and How to Uncover What's Next

VOTING RIGHTS LAB **Voting Rights Lab is a nonpartisan** organization that is accelerating the movement for free and fair elections through expert analysis, research, and innovations. We track election-related legislation in all 50 states in our State **Voting Rights Tracker.** 

Despite the headlines, 2021 was not defined by voting restrictions. Many states expanded ballot access with policies related to early voting, ballot cure, automatic voter registration (AVR), rights restoration, and transparency.

# **Early Voting**



## **Ballot Cure**

13 states, including Texas, Maine and **Kentucky**, enacted legislation that created or improved voters' ability to correct errors on their absentee ballot envelopes. Maryland created this type of ballot cure process by regulation.

# **Automatic Voter Registration**

Connecticut, Delaware, and Hawaii created automatic voter registration. New York added the State University of New York as an AVR agencies. Other states, including Nevada and California, improved or expanded AVR processes.


# **Ballot Tracking**

In 2021, 9 states passed legislation to create, facilitate, or improve the accessibility of ballot tracking tools for voters, including California, lowa, Kentucky, New York, Texas, and Utah.

On certain election policies, we saw a widening divide among states.

For example, states moved in opposite directions on vote by mail, same-day registration, and voter ID.



# **Same-Day Registration**


Hawaii expanded same-day registration to include online registration, while New Hampshire restricted it by adding a photo requirement. Montana eliminated same-day registration on Election Day.

# **Voter ID**



In 2021, a deeply disturbing legislative trend emerged: Thirty-three states introduced over 200 individual bills to undermine the administration of elections.

**Fourteen states enacted** this type of legislation.

## **Partisan Election Reviews**


8 states introduced bills to review the certified 2020 election results. 12 states introduced bills to authorize review processes for election results in one or more future elections. Others have initiated reviews extra-legislatively.

# **Handing Power to Partisans**

21 states introduced bills that would give the state legislature or another partisan body more direct control over local election conduct, vote counting, or certification.

# **Criminalizing Election Officials**

In 2021, **21** states enacted legislation authorizing new or increased criminal penalties against election officials or third parties assisting voters.



# Renewed election subversion efforts have taken a variety of forms in 2022:

- 1 Problematic reviews of election results
- **2** Criminalization of election officials
- **3** Partisan power grabs
- 4 Bans on electronic tabulators

- 2. Use summaries as a starting point
- 3. Know the context
- 4. Read the bill holistically
- 5. **Investigate** cross references and amendments
