The John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act, and For The People Act of 2021

The John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act aims to strengthen legal protections against discriminatory voting policies and practices, restoring key provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965.

- The updated Voting Rights Act responds to recent Supreme Court rulings by setting requirements that must be followed.
- Voting districts with a history of discriminatory voting practices, will have to receive approval from the federal government to change their voting practices.
- The updated Voting Rights Act strengthens protections for everyone to vote.
- States that try to use voting practices that discriminate will be held accountable for their actions.

FOR THE PEOPLE ACT OF 2021

Since March 2021, the For The People Act has been sitting in Congress because protecting, and advancing voting rights is not a priority for some U.S. Senators.

This is why voting in every election matters!

The Act is a landmark piece of law designed to reform various aspects of the United States' voting system, enhancing voting rights, and curbing the influence of money in politics.

- Key provisions of the Act include automatic voter registration, expanded early voting, and increased transparency for political donations.
- It seeks to combat partisan gerrymandering by establishing independent redistricting commissions and aims to strengthen election security measures.
- The passage of the For The People Act could bring significant changes to the American voting processes, shaping the future of the country.
