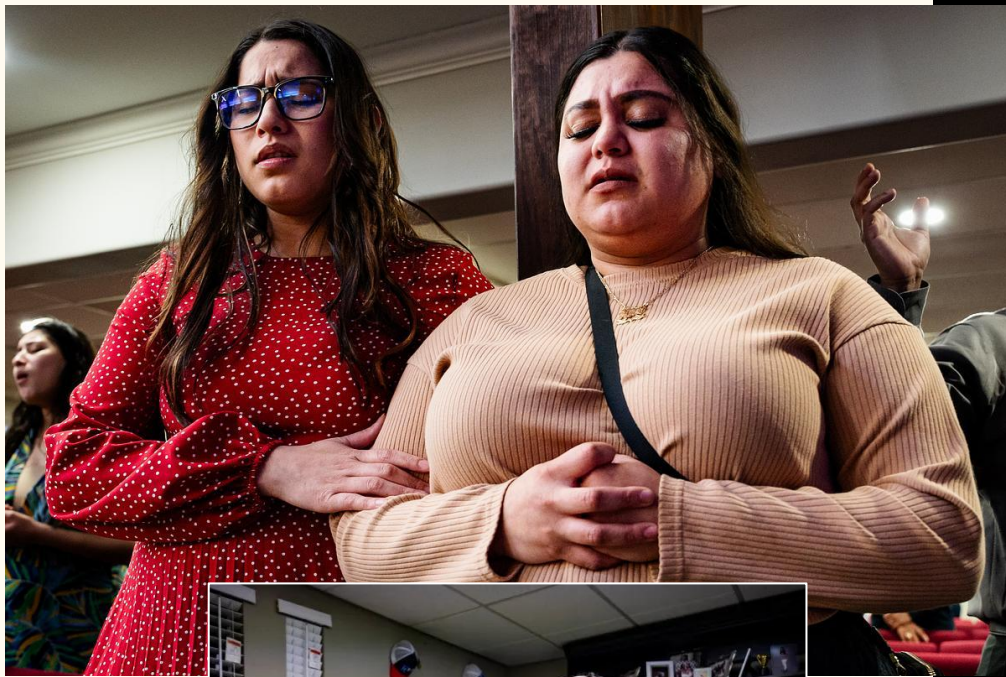
For these Tulsa Catholics, danza performance is about more than dance. It's a form of prayer.

# Trump's immigration push transforms outreach, operations for Tulsa group

1. Having conversations with organizations about immigration, asking even if they don't directly serve immigrant communities
2. Reminding organizations that they aren't the only ones
3. Providing space to fact check. This isn't for them to change things but to make sure the information is accurate before it publishes.





## Tulsa pastor's deportation leaves a family broken, church community empty

- Asking them if I could meet them at their preferred place.
- Asking them for more. Who else can I talk to?
- Observing them where they find comfort. Allowing them to cry and pause when needed.
- Staying in touch with them afterwards.
